

Are your child's immunizations up-to-date?

Vaccination is the best way to protect your child against a number of serious and sometimes deadly diseases. Routine childhood vaccines are free in B.C.

Getting children vaccinated:

- Helps protect them from severe illness and hospitalization
- Protects family members who may be at increased risk of getting very sick if infected
- Reduces the spread of viruses in the community

Childhood immunizations (other than COVID-19)

For the best protection, your child should get vaccinated on time following the recommended childhood immunization schedule as closely as possible.

For school-aged kids, vaccinations should be done upon entry to Kindergarten, grade six and grade nine.

COVID-19 pediatric vaccine

COVID-19 vaccination is recommended for children five years of age and older and is available for free in B.C. The COVID-19 vaccine can be received at the same time or any time before or after other vaccines.

If your child is five years of age or older, you may request the COVID-19 vaccine during their routine childhood immunization appointment. Alternatively, you may register them on the [Get Vaccinated provincial system](#) to be notified of when to book an appointment.
